## Hurricane Alert Procedures

The National Hurricane Center warns that some part of Florida typically is threatened by a hurricane or tropical storm each year and provides information about hurricanes and other severe weather on its website at http://www.nhc.noaa.gov. During any threatening weather, the College monitors this site and notifies others as necessary.

When a serious storm or hurricane threatens our region, the College may decide to cancel classes or close campuses and we will send out an announcement on **Valencia Alert**, place information on the College's website www.valenciacollege.edu and disseminate details to local TV and radio outlets. If this website is not accessible, please visit our emergency information website at http://valenciacollege.info. If you have not already signed up for **Valencia Alert**, please do so by visiting <u>https://atlas.valenciacollege.edu</u> to sign up: After signing in to Atlas, look for the emergency alerts channel in the My Atlas tab.

We will strive to provide adequate warning to all students, faculty and staff if a serious situation arises. As in the past, we will use the West Campus Security Office as our Emergency Operations Center to coordinate mission critical services.
